2019 in Review

International Relations

The City of Braunschweig fosters contacts to numerous cities in different countries. It has twinning partnerships with seven cities and friendship agreements with two. This report offers an overview of the various activities of the department International Relations of the City of Braunschweig in the year 2019.

Highlight in 2019 was the 13th issue of the Braunschweig Cultural Night with all nine partner cities participating actively in the events. About sixty artists have contributed to an unforgettable international happening.

Common activities

Twin and friendship cities at the 13th Cultural Night

True to the motto „culture connects“ the city of Braunschweig invited its twin and friendship cities to the 13th issue of the Braunschweig Cultural Night on 22 June. This is one of the biggest and most diverse cultural events of the region. All nine partner cities accepted the invitation and sent about sixty artists to Braunschweig, some of them accompanied by official delegations.

The British twin city Bath inspired the audience with two per-formances: the ukulele band "Uke can't be serious" ...




and the musical theatre group "Bath Operatic and Dramatic Society" (BODS).

The „International Relations" department organised the artists' stay , their stage performances as well as an interesting program for the guests.

In order to make use of the synergetic effect, a summer party was organised with the international associations and societies which are involved in the exchange with the partner cities. So, on 21 June 2019, one day before the Cultural Night, about 160 members of the associations were celebrating together with the international guests, who were welcomed by Lord Mayor Ulrich Markurth at the Kulturpunkt West, the venue of the party. The performances of the artists who had already arrived in Braunschweig, a join-in concert with Indonesian Angklung instruments and a workshop for Chinese calligraphy were the highlights of the afternoon, while an international buffet offered by the members of the associations made it a perfect afternoon.

Bandung/Indonesia

Consulate General from Hamburg at the Carnival

A delegation headed by Consul General Dr. Bambang Susanto from the Consulate General of the Republic of Indonesia in Hamburg visited the Braunschweig carnival parade called „Schoduvell“. After the reception of the president of the carnival committee, the official members of the delegation watched the parade from the balcony of the Old Town Hall, while two Indonesian students presented themselves in traditional clothing on one of the wagons of the parade.


Bath/Great Britain

Staff from building department of Braunschweig municipality visited twin city Bath / Great Britain

Two staff members of the building department accompanied by a colleague from the "International Relations" department visited Braunschweig's twin city Bath in Southwest of England from 26 to 29 March 2019.

The visit was initiated by Mayor Anketell-Jones, who had declared the issue of environmental protection to the leitmotif of his term of office.

Besides the reception by Mayor Anketell-Jones at the guildhall followed by a meeting and a visit at the national water and wastewater company Wessex Water, the two staff members of the building department gave a lecture about "challenges of environmental protection in Bath and Braunschweig" at the Bath Royal Literary & Scientific Institution for members of the German Society and the Bath-Braunschweig-Twinning Association. Apart from that, the guests from Braunschweig visited the Roman Baths and learned about the "Footprint Project" of Bath Abbey, a project for the restoration of the flooring of this famous church with sustainable use of the heat of the energy from the Roman Baths.

Kiryat Tivon/Israel

Citizens journey to Kiryat Tivon

In cooperation with the German-Israeli Society Braunschweig (DIG e. V.) and a travel agency, a citizen's journey was organised to Israel from 8 until 16 March 2019. The tour group consisting of seventeen people also visited Braunschweig's twin city Kiryat Tivon. The visit was supported by the department "International Relations" of the city of Braunschweig.

The group was welcomed by Mayor Ido Grinblum and the members of the Foreign Relations Committee in Kiryat Tivon. The guests from Braunschweig lived in host families, thus gaining insight into the daily life of the twin city.

The visit in Kiryat Tivon started with a picnic for the people of the town and the guests. Then the tour group visited special places and sights in the neighbourhood: Tefen with the German-Speaking Jewry Heritage Museum in Israel, the Golan Heights, Migdal at the Sea of Galilee and its new church with its interesting architecture.

The program in Kiryat Tivon also included the village Kfar Tikva (village of hope), where people with disabilities live together, similar to those in kibbutzim, as well as a visit to the Jewish-Arab kindergarden Ein Bustan/Maayan Babustan (fountain in the garden).

After the visit in Kiryat Tivon, the tour continued via Haifa (Baha'i Gardens) and Zichron Yaakov to Jerusalem. A look from the Mount of Olives to the Old City and a walk through the Old City were followed by a visit at Yad Vashem (Holocaust Memorial).

The journey went on to the baptism site at Jordan River, Masada (mountain fortress at the Dead Sea) and of course to the extremely saline Dead Sea where the group members had the possibility to bathe. Afterwards the group travelled to Tel Aviv which was the last station before the journey home.

Due to the high demand, there will be a further citizen's tour to Kiryat Tivon in 2020.

An Ethiopian, a Bedouin and a Russian girl – a Film from Kiryat Tivon

The city of Braunschweig and the German-Israeli Society (DIG) invited the young filmmaker Dalal Zubedat from Kiryat Tivon from 29 March until 5 of April to Braunschweig. She presented her short film "An Ethiopian, a Bedouin and a Russian girl"

The film was shown on 30 March in the premises of the women's association frauen BUNT e.V. and on 1 April at the event hall "Roter Saal". The screening was followed by vibrant discussions.

The documentary tells about three students whose parents come from Ethiopia, Russia and a Bedouin village in Israel. Looking for their different identities and tracking their family histories, the girls travel to Germany and meet there young Germans, refugees and immigrants.

Before Dalal Zubedat started her film studies, she was the first Bedouin with the Israeli police. And as first Bedouin football trainer, she works with Jewish and Arab youngsters.

During her stay in Braunschweig, the young film producer also visited the International Office of the University of Braunschweig, met other students and got to know Braunschweig.

Members of the Foreign Relations Committee in Tivon, who organise the participation of the Braunschweig artists and also send an artist from Tivon to Braunschweig every year, also care for the accommodation of the Braunschweig artists with a host family and for a sightseeing tour in Kiryat Tivon and the region around.

The artists sent from Braunschweig to Kiryat Tivon are chosen by the association “Friends of Fine Arts in Braunschweig” (FBK).

Sousse/Tunesia

Delegation from Sousse visited Braunschweig

From 17 until 23 February 2019, Mayor Taoufik Laribi from Sousse visited Braunschweig in the company of Mr. Maher Amara, deputy head of the Building Department of the city of Sousse.

The guests took part in the international symposium „RE-WATER Braunschweig“, which was organised by Abwasserverband Braunschweig (water and soil association), the Norddeutsche Wasserzentrum (NWZ, Association for Sustainable Water Management), Stadtentwässerung Braunschweig GmbH (municipal sewage treatment company) and the University of Braunschweig. Since 2014, the city of Braunschweig has been cooperating with the University of Braunschweig in order to support its twin city Sousse with the project for the renaturation of the Hamdoun river south of Sousse, contaminated by insufficiently cleared wastewater and bad waste treatment.

The opportunity was seized to hold meetings with experts from Braunschweig University about the continuation of the project. Apart from that the guests from Sousse could observe the processes in the wastewater treatment plant Steinhof and the waste disposal at the ALBA GmbH Braunschweig.

Besides this scientific exchange, several meetings were held about the further development of the partnership between the two cities, including a visit at the municipal fire brigade and at the municipal school of music.

Delegation from Sousse at the Braunschweig Carnival

As in previous years, Tunisian guests from the sister city Sousse also honoured the Braunschweig Carnival in 2019. They participated in the parade called “Schoduvel” on a carnival wagon decorated with flags and banners from Sousse while a music group of eight was walking ahead.

As part of an extensive program, the guests also attended the great ceremonial meeting of the Carnival Association of the Rhinelanders, the reception by the president of the carnival committee, where they were greeted by Mayor Annegret Ihbe, and the “after-show party” following the parade. Sousse intends to participate in the Schoduvel 2020 too.

As there is interest in an exchange in the field of music, this delegation visit was used to consider a possible cooperation with the municipal school of music.

Cooperation for the purification of the Hamdoun River

On 29 April 2019, a stakeholder meeting was held in Sousse to continue the "Oued Hamdoun" project aiming at the purification of the Hamdoun River, which is heavily polluted by waste water and garbage. Participants of this meeting were Professor Müfit Bahadir and the master student Elina Domscheit from the TU Braunschweig as well as a staff member from the "International Relations" of the city of Braunschweig. This session marked the start of Elina Domscheit's master's thesis elaborating a feasibility study for the renaturation of the river using a plant-based sewage treatment plant. The results of this study will be made available to the city of Sousse.

As a result of this meeting and taking into account the partnership relations between the city of Münster and the city of Monastir, which was also affected by the pollution of the river, an exchange between the governorates of Sousse and Monastir could also be established.

Zhuhai/China


Lord Mayor Ulrich Markurth visited Braunschweig's twin city Zhuhai/China with a business delegation



The Erasmus+ project aims at promoting solidarity in Europe through exchange projects. The last mutual visit will take place in spring 2020 when the students from Braunschweig and Mediaş will travel to León in Spain for a week.
